



Let your spirit fly: An R+B song for children. Children learn the dimensions of music through singing and appraising this song and other R+B music.

French

Phonetics 1 / I'm learning French Children learn the knowledge and skills to be able to introduce themselves, say how they feel and have a wider appreciation for the country/countries where the foreign language is spoken.

Vegetables <u>Children learn</u> 10 common vegetables in their plural form with their definite articles. They will learn the basic transactional language required take part in a roleplay activity based on buying different quantities of vegetables from a market stall.

Year 3 Curriculum Map Term 1 2024-2025

Geography

Why do people live near volcanoes?

Children learn that the Earth is constructed in layers, and the crust is divided into tectonic plates. They study the formation and distribution of mountains, volcances and earthquakes and use Mount Etna to identify how human interaction shapes a volcanic landscape.

PSHE

Being Me in My World: Becognise self-worth and identity and discuss new challenges. Learn about the need for rules and explore choices and consequences.

Celebrating Difference: Learn about difference families. Practise methods to calm down and "Solve it Together". Revisit the topic of bullying.

Science

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Materials (Rocks / fossils). In this unit, the children will learn how to compare and group together different kinds of rocks gn, the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties. They learn how to describe how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock and <u>finally</u> they will learn how to <u>record</u> to the soles are made from rocks and organic

RE RE

What do Hindus believe God is like?

This is the first time children will encounter Hinduism. They will look at Hindu deities and explore how they help Hindus describe God. Children will make simple links between beliefs about God and how Hindus live together with different ways in which Hindus worship.

How do festivals + family life show what matters to Jewish people?

Children will make links between the Exodus story and Jewish beliefs about God and his relationship with the Jewish people. They will describe how Jewish people show their beliefs through worship whilst suggesting their own ideas about what is worth celebratine and rememberine.

07 Home Learning

Maths Fluency: Learning times tables is really important. After all, they're the building blocks of maths, and with their multiplications mastered, they can do anything! Therefore, each child from Year 2 – Year 6 has a log in for 'Times Tables Rock Stars' (TTRS). This is a carefully sequenced programme of daily times tables practice online which helps your child learn their tables in a fun and engaging way. Please encourage your child to log on to TTRS as often as possible. Children's use of these apps are monitored closely by teachers. Each week, one child per class is awarded the TTRS Champion.

Wider Curriculum: Each half-term your child will receive an optional Home Learning Grid linking to our Wider Curriculum Topics. Children can choose from this grid as and when they wish. This work may be recorded in a variety of ways, including photos or films that can be emailed to the class teacher. Wider Curriculum homework will be shared and celebrated in class.

Reading

Throughout the school, we emphasise developing a love of reading and books. From Reception to Year 6, reading should take place daily.

In Year 3, reading books will be changed every Thursday. Regular daily reading at home is so very important to help your child in becoming a fluent reader. We encourage parents to read and discuss literature with their children and believe that reading should be a shared experience where possible. We are happy for children to read their allocated reading book, their school library book or any other reading material. We ask that adults at home note what they have read in their own reading record. Please read the information in your child's reading record about how you can support them best when reading at home.
