What we've been learning recently

English – Our new learning journey is all about Roald Dahl. The children have written fact files, made predictions based on short clips and compared extracts of work written by Roald Dahl and other authors. The children have really enjoyed studying different Roald Dahl texts and how he uses speech to develop characterisation and makes up funny words!

Maths – We have begun the second leg of the multiplication and division journey. The children have been using their multiplication skills to multiply 2 digit numbers by a 1 digit number, both with no exchange and using flexible partitioning.

Wider Curriculum – Our new enquiry question is 'Did the Stone Age pave the path to Rome?'. The children enjoyed looking at artefacts and exploring the life of people from these ages as an introduction to the topic. The children have been using charcoals in art to create animal sketches. In geography we have been looking at land use in the local area and in music learning to sing and play 'Three Little Birds'.

Over the next fortnight we will be...

- Concluding our multiplication and division journey by dividing a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number with remainders. They will finish with an end of unit assessment.
- Continuing to learn all about the creation story in RE.
- Looking at a timeline in History of the Stone Age, Iron Age and Romans.
- Studying and creating our own Cave Art.
- Playing Handball and Gymnastics in Physical Education.
